Northern Illinois Food Bank Receives Grant from Stateline Community Foundation Support Enables Continued Food Distributions at School-Based Pantry in South Beloit

(GENEVA, IL – March 2, 2022) – Northern Illinois Food Bank is pleased to announce it has received a \$3,000 grant from the Stateline Community Foundation. These funds will be used to support the SOBO Food Pantry at Blackhawk Elementary School in South Beloit School District 320.



The SOBO Food Pantry provides food to individuals and families in South Beloit, averaging 40 families at each distribution. During times of the greatest need, such as holidays, the pantry has served up to 200 families.

Despite the challenges of the pandemic, SOBO has maintained its schedule of being open for two hours on two days every month. Currently, families are invited to walk into the panty so they can choose the food they need. The pantry also provides home delivery for those with limited access.

"Thank you so much, Stateline Community Foundation and Northern Illinois Food Bank, for supporting us," said Rachel Blomquist, MSW, School Social Worker at South Beloit School District 320. "Having the food pantry at one of our schools ensures food is accessible for families and children at risk of hunger."

"We're grateful for the support of Stateline Community Foundation," said Yvette Sellers, the Food Bank's Agency Relations Area Leader for Winnebago County. "About 69 percent of children in the South Beloit area are identified as living below the federal poverty rate, and SOBO Food Pantry provides critical food assistance to those families."

Food at the pantry includes cereals, milk, eggs, cheese, fresh produce, meats, pasta, rice, soups and healthy canned meals, snacks and personal care items. During the holidays, SOBO provides turkeys and hams through a drive-through distribution to avoid congestion and keep neighbors and volunteers safe.
