United Way of Kankakee and Iroquois Counties Supports Northern Illinois Food Bank's Build Health Communities Program

(GENEVA, Ill., October 6, 2022) – Northern Illinois Food Bank recently received a \$2,000 grant from United Way of Kankakee and Iroquois Counties in support of our first hospital-based food pantry, a Wellness Food Clinic located at Riverside Healthcare's East Court Primary Care Clinic in Kankakee.

The Wellness Food Clinic is an intervention provided through our Build Healthy Communities Screen and Intervene Initiative, working alongside healthcare organizations to address the need for nutritious food for patients identified as food-insecure. The initiative's goal is for individuals with chronic conditions or those who are at risk for chronic disease to be able to access nutritious food that is vital for disease management and help them develop a healthy diet that can reduce future health risks.

Riverside Healthcare screens patients for food insecurity and those that screen positive receive a referral to visit the Wellness Food Clinic twice monthly to access an assortment of fresh fruits and vegetables, lean meats and other groceries at no charge. They may also receive wrap-around services, onsite, such as nutrition education and blood pressure and BMI screenings, through community partnerships, to address multiple needs at a single point-of-service.

Neighbors experiencing food insecurity are disproportionately impacted by diet-related disease and nutritional deficiencies. For our neighbors currently dealing with both chronic health conditions and limited resources, the risk is even greater. In FY22 (7/1/21 – 6/30/22), approximately 7,000 patients have been screened, of which 500 were referred to the clinic, which has served more than 200 households.
