Northern Illinois Food Bank's 12th Annual "A Taste That Matters" Raised \$446,500 for Hunger Relief

Over 600 Guests Enjoyed an Evening Filled with Fun, Food, and Auction

Geneva, IL (June 24, 2024) – Northern Illinois Food Bank is thrilled to announce the 12th annual "A Taste That Matters" event, presented by Jewel-Osco, raised more than \$446,500 which translates into over \$3.5 million in essential resources for neighbors facing hunger.

"A Taste That Matters" is one of the Food Bank's flagship fundraisers, held this year at Drury Lane Theatre and Events in Oakbrook Terrace, IL. More than 600 attendees enjoyed an extensive silent auction, open bar, and food tastings from dozens of local chefs and vendors.
