

Northern Illinois Food Bank Sends 1,000 ALDI Disaster Relief Boxes to San Diego for Flood Victims Facing Hunger – Truck Arrives at Feeding San Diego on Saturday, Feb. 10

Disaster Relief Shipment includes 24,840 pounds lbs. of food or 20,700 meals.

GENEVA, IL (February 9, 2024) - In response to the heartbreaking natural disaster in San Diego, Northern Illinois Food Bank shipped a full semi-truckload with 1,000 ALDI Disaster Relief Boxes to Feeding San Diego to help neighbors facing hunger. Each box includes dry good products rich in proteins and nutritious food that could easily be prepared in natural disaster areas by neighbors who do not have access to boiling water or a kitchen.

The shipment will arrive at Feeding San Diego at 9477 Waples Street, Suite 100, San Diego, CA 92121 on Saturday, February 10, 2024, between 8-10 am PST.

Julie Yurko, President and CEO at Northern Illinois Food Bank in partnership with Feeding America and Amazon Freight, mobilized relief efforts to help ensure neighbors in San Diego will have the food they need to survive. "Nobody should have to worry about how they get their next meal when disaster strikes," said Julie Yurko, President and CEO at Northern Illinois Food Bank.

The shipment was picked up from Northern Illinois Food Bank on Thursday, February 8, and includes 40 pallets of Disaster Relief Boxes with a total of 24,840 pounds lbs. of food or 20,700 meals. Upon arrival, the life-saving food will be distributed to victims lacking shelter or food.

Each disaster relief box was packed by ALDI employees and includes these ALDI exclusive dry goods: Meal Replacement Shake 6 pk, Peanut Butter Jar, Granola Bar boxes, Energy bar box, Graham Crackers box, Chicken salad and crackers, Tuna salad and crackers, Instant Oatmeal box, Chunky Soup Cans Spaghetti Rings (O's) cans, Cheddar Broccoli/Tomato Basil Soup tubs, Round Butter Crackers box, Applesauce cups pack, Tuna Pouches, and Paper Bowls and Plastic cutlery.
