
# **General Stats**



Over **90 million** meals were distributed in FY 2024.



Volunteers contribute roughly **140,000 hours** every year – equivalent to over 60 full-time employees.



Network of **over 900 agencies** – pantries, feeding sites, soup kitchens, school-based pantries.



We own and operate our own fleet: we have 38 vehicles (including 13 semis) and our 27 drivers cumulatively logged 757,317 miles last year.



Almost **200 employees**, some seasonal and/or part-time.



We held **564 Mobile Markets** last year, distributing meals to neighbors who for assorted reasons cannot get to a brick-and-mortar pantry.

## **Food Bank History**

- Founded as Bethlehem Center in 1983 by Sister Rosemarie Burian.
- First located on Easy Street in Carol Stream.
- In 1994, Bethlehem Center joined America's Second Harvest, now called Feeding America.
- The Food Bank relocated to St Charles in 1995.
- Bethlehem Center was rebranded as Northern Illinois Food Bank in 2000.
- The North Suburban Center opens in Park City (Lake County) in 2001.
- Merged with Hunger Connection, a similar organization in Rockford, in 2005.
- Northern Illinois Food Bank was named "Food Bank of the Year" by Feeding America in 2010.
- Our main location, the West Suburban Center, is a 169,000 square-foot office, warehouse, shipping, and volunteer hall in Geneva. Built in 2011, it was one of the first LEED Gold-certified facilities in the Feeding America network.
- The Northwest Center relocated to Loves Park in 2012, and then back to a larger facility in Rockford in 2015.
- In 2018 we opened the South Suburban Center in Joliet.
- Opening in 2025, The Northwest Center will move to an even larger facility on Sandy Hollow Rd in Rockford and will be called the Northern Illinois Food Bank Neighborhood Market

### **Program History**

- The first distribution was 288 lbs. of food.
- By 1984, 80 agencies in 10 counties were receiving food from the new Food Bank.
- The Holiday Meal Box program, Mobile Pantries, and Child Nutrition programs all began in 1999.
- In 2018 we opened the Winnebago Community Market at our Northwest Center, our first direct-to-neighbor pantry.
- My Pantry Express was piloted in 2019, one of the first online pantries in the country.
- At the height of the pandemic, Northern Illinois Food Bank distributed 100 million meals through our network of over 900 agencies. We currently distribute over 80 million meals every year.
